

FRA U20 Championships Tables & Report

After Skiddaw: 7 July 2014



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The U20 Championships is open to runners born 1994 or later. Up to the best 4 results out of 6 can be counted. Team points are scored when a club has 2 or more runners at an event; the best 2 or 3 scores on the day are added to give the team score. Runners and clubs must score at 3 or more events to be eligible for a medal. Runners with only one race may not be shown in the final results.

Report

Apologies for the big delay with the tables, and also that there was no write-up in the Summer issue of Fellrunner, I can promise a full report in the Autumn magazine.

Five races out of the Six have now been run, with Mansfield taking the series to heart and already being runaway winners in the team competition. I am told their women enjoy the longer races, with a strong turnout at Coniston and a pair of runners at Skiddaw, interesting feedback given that I ruled Kentmere out as being a little too long for the U20s Championships.

Two of the recent races were specially selected for the U20s Championships, with a good women's turnout at Knowl Hill, but otherwise not the biggest of showings. Anthony Dalton made good use of near-home advantage to take the overall win, and combined with the U20s win at Skiddaw he is already champion. With the female competition surprisingly spurning the longer races, Amelia's win at Skiddaw puts her to the top of the women's table, although going in too the last race it is still a five-way battle.

Clougha was a completely different story, with the U18s providing plenty of tough competition. Anthony Dalton didn't quite manage it against U18 Jack Willis, with the pair taking the top two spots in the senior's race. Zoe Harding and Lauren Munro-Bennett were up to the task, with U20 series-regular Bronwyn Jenkinson coming in next behind them and first U18. The many U18 runners have doubled the size of the tables, but runners with only one race will not be shown in the final tables (maybe unless it was a podium finish).
